

The SID was born out of a vision to serve a segment of science previously unrepresented by the medical societies of the United States: Investigative Dermatology. The founders saw a need for an organization ... to promote investigative dermatology to a fully respected position among the medical specialties. In tandem with the establishment of the society, they sought to develop a new scientific journal that would act as a singular resource for investigative work in cutaneous biology. This vision was realized when the SID was founded, bylaws were adopted and a board of nine directors was appointed on June 10, 1937 at the Hotel Dennis in Atlantic City, New Jersey. The Journal of Investigative Dermatology (JID) was launched, with Marion B. Sulzberger as its first editor, and the first Annual Meeting was held in April 1938 in New York City.



At this inaugural meeting topics ranged from "Vitamins and Fatty Acids as Fungicides", the "Transfer of Immunity to Syphilis from Mother to Off-Spring" and the "Role of Skin in Immunity".

We have come a long way since that first meeting - our society now includes representation from across the country and around the world. I am certain that the founders could have never envisioned the SID's growth and current success. And so it is, due to the hard work and commitment of our Program and Education Committee Members and Chairs, as well as the entire Organizing Committee, that we bring to you another incredible slate of special guest lectures, symposia, and cutting-edge research. We are particularly excited to highlight a new session on Climate Change as it relates to skin biology and disease. I invite each and every one of you to become engaged, or even more engaged, in this amazing society and to network throughout the meeting. The SID community is expansive, and our goal is to extend our outreach even further to include all investigators and clinician-scientists whose focus is skin biology and disease research - we call on you to help.

Meeting Information & Policies

CODE OF CONDUCT

All members of the Society for Investigative Dermatology (SID) (or attendees of the Society's functions) are required to follow the Society's Code of Conduct. This includes, but is not limited to, any Society conference, other meeting, function, event, or professional activity.

The behavior of the Society's members reflects on the reputation of the Society and should create a safe and professional atmosphere free of harassment, stalking, threats, abusive conduct, and bullying whether physical or verbal. Any member or attendee participating in these unwanted behaviors risk expulsion (without refund) from the event and the Society as well as further consequences including the involvement of local law enforcement.

Society members (and attendees of Society's functions) are expected to:

Reporting Procedures




